There are two ways that you can join our growing network of voluntary and community-based youth organisations in the Scottish Borders. You can join as Member or as a Subscriber. This guide is designed to help you to understand the benefits of joining our network and finding the right fit for your organisation.

Why join YouthBorders?

YouthBorders is the network of voluntary and community-based youth organisations in the Scottish Borders, supporting and promoting good quality youth work. Joining our network gives you instant access to peer support, networking events and opportunities, high quality training, and membership support services. YouthBorders has a skilled and experienced staff team, on hand to support your organisation, staff, volunteers and trustees to grow and develop. We are a membership led organisation, and have proven track record for working collaboratively and in partnership with our members and other stakeholders to further our aim. The objects of YouthBorders

- ✓ Facilitating networking opportunities and event, providing information and representing the interests of the youth work sector strategically in local, regional and national forums.
- ✓ Offering a comprehensive support packing for members
- ✓ Actively promoting the setting up of new groups in the community that will benefit young people
- ✓ Providing support and training for adults who work with or support young people in our network or partnerships
- ✓ Providing opportunities for young people to engage in learning to develop themselves as youth workers or in other leadership roles.

Step 1: Check your eligibility to join our network

Every organisation which joins our network must demonstrate that they meet our minimum quality standards:

- ✓ operate or be based within the Scottish Borders
- ✓ support the vision, aims and objectives of YouthBorders
- ✓ operate in a not-for-profit way, with a governing document (e.g. constitution or articles of association)
- ✓ not be politically affiliated
- ✓ have a child protection/safeguarding policy in place with satisfactory recruitment process for staff and volunteers
- ✓ have a health and safety policy; and
- ✓ have appropriate insurance

Step 2: Which is right for you, Member or Subscriber?

What your main purpose and objects are will impact on how you join YouthBorders.

Member

You will **join our network as a Member** if you are a youth group that takes a **youth work approach** to your practice and your work will further [Scotland's Youth Work Outcomes](#).

Examples: local youth clubs, locality youth projects, local service provision of national third sector youth or children's organisations, specialist support services for young people, youth specific arts groups, youth specific training and employability providers. This excludes uniformed youth groups.

As a Member you join YouthBorders and [Youth Scotland](#) through our joint membership offer

Subscriber

You will **join our network as Subscriber** if you are a group or organisation from **any sector** which either **promotes or supports youth work** or **wishes to support the aims and objects of YouthBorders**. Subscribers create positive benefit to young people through community-based activities (aged 8-25).

Groups joining us as a Subscriber may include those where work with young people is a smaller part of their bigger purpose, where young people are supported as volunteer leaders, this will also include uniformed youth groups. *Examples: community sports groups, heritage projects, intergenerational work, uniformed youth groups, training providers, environmental action groups, music or dance groups.*

As a Subscriber you join YouthBorders. In our governing documents, this makes your organisation an associate member.

Step 3: Join Us

If you are ready to find out more, please get in touch with our team who can guide you through the joining process. We can also advise and support you with getting your group up and running and developing policies to help you meet our minimum quality standards for membership.

Alternatively, if you are confident about which way of joining is right for you and you can evidence all of our eligibility criteria, you can download, complete and return your application form and supporting documents.
